PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

Ask a Reference Librarian: A reference librarian will be available to assist patrons and answer questions. If you need help with a mobile device—whether it's a laptop, tablet, or smartphone, be sure to bring it with you. Bring your library card and password. Remember, if you have an Apple device, make sure you know your Apple ID and password.

Computer Basics: Would you like to learn how to use a computer? Are you unsure of computer terminology? This class is for you!

Creating Desktop Wallpaper in Canva: Join us for a class in which we create desktop wallpaper in Canva! We will discuss the basics of the website; practice utilizing templates, colors, fonts; upload photos; and download our finished product.

Getting Started with Newspaper Databases: Join us for a demonstration on how to access historic newspapers through our library databases. Feel free to bring a laptop, tablet, or smartphone to follow along.

Grow with Google: Get Your Local Business on Google Search and Maps: Help the people in your community find your business on Google Search and Maps. Join us for a free workshop to get started.

Images of Old New Orleans: Join us for a slideshow showcasing drawings, paintings, and photographs of New Orleans from the 18th and 19th centuries.

Making a Will: LSBA/LEAP LEGAL WORKSHOP WATCH PARTY: During this Zoom presentation, a volunteer attorney will discuss why making a will is important and what you need to know about drafting your own. After the presentation, you can ask questions, publicly, through Zoom as time permits.

Pope Leo XIV and Researching his Creole Heritage: Pope Leo XIV is the first American pope and also the first with documented ancestral ties to Louisiana Creoles of color, a community with historical ties to people of African descent. In this lecture Jari C. Honora will share the discoveries made about Pope Leo XIV's genealogical heritage including his ties to St. Tammany Parish.

Using Courthouse Records to Explore Family History: Courthouse records often contain primary information that is invaluable for genealogists and family historians. Using the courthouse records of the family of Abner Jenkins, a prominent early settler of St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, Robin Perkins demonstrates how these records can provide details that enrich the family story and bring our ancestors to life.
