Creating a Monthly Budget with Microsoft Excel: Computer users who are already knowledgeable in how to use a mouse, manipulate windows, type on a keyboard, and have intermediate skills with Microsoft Excel will learn how to utilize these existing skills to create a functional monthly budget spreadsheet.
